



WCID #1 Rate Increases to Fund Improvements, Increased Operating Costs

Beginning in November, WCID #1 customers will see a water and sewer rate increase to fund improvements aimed at ensuring reliable, efficient service, as well as increased operating costs due to inflation. A typical residential customer who uses 5,000 gallons of water a month should see an increase of approximately \$8.75 on their monthly bill.

The WCID #1 Board of Directors approved the rate increase in September to fund 2023 budget items, including the following:

- A district-wide water meter replacement program to install reliable, efficient state-of-the-art smart meters. This advanced metering system also will allow customers to monitor their water usage.
- A scheduled increase in revenue bond payments to fund capital improvements approved by WCID #1 voters in 2012
- Rising employee benefit costs and competitive wage increases
- Higher operating costs due to inflation
